COMINGS & (SADLY) GOINGS

I am writing this short piece with a heavy heart. Ken, Wendy and Floki have become much loved by all of us and they have been a wonderful part of our Church family. None of us want to see them leave us but Church rules specify that a priest cannot have their own Parish at the age of 70. In most walks of life, compulsory retirement on age grounds is no longer allowed but, in the Church, it is, and it is enforced. Revd Paul Carr and his wife Paula will commence their ministry on the 20th January 2024. Ken's contract will end on the same day. In practical terms, Paul and Paula will arrive a few days before their contract starts and their labradoodle (Dillon) will be along as soon as possible afterwards. Ken will stand down at a date to be agreed during those first three weeks of January. No interregnum has many benefits for us, but it also presents challenges particularly around housing for our clergy in the early weeks. It is Paul and Paula's intention to live in the Parish House that we presently have tenanted, and we need to bring that tenancy to an end. Closer to the time we will be arranging a service of thanks for Ken and Wendy, no doubt followed by a party! On arrival Paul will be given Permission to Officiate (PTO) status, so that he can start his ministry immediately with a formal licencing service arranged as soon as the Diocese allows. We all look forward to getting to know Paul and Paula (not forgetting Dillon) in the coming months. Please keep Ken & Wendy and Paul & Paula in your prayers as this is a challenging and emotional time for all of them. (Graham Hare)
