CHURCH FINANCES

How are we doing at the end of July, seven months into the year? The short answer is much better than we expected when we did the budget last November. Church giving at €60k is €6k above last year and budget. Ancillary income from church lettings and fundraising is €2K up on last year. Costs are up on last year due to recruitment of our new priest and Synod but still leaves us a little ahead of break-even. When we did the wedding and ROV budget we had 30 on the books. We hoped for late bookings and budgeted for 40. The latest figure is 51 booked for this year so, come the end of the year we will be showing a surplus on weddings although below last year where we had many weddings brought forward from Covid. My forecast for the end of the year is for a small surplus, well below last year but much better than budget.
