GOD SLOT

Do we limit God in what we believe he can do? We might believe that God has the power to deliver people from many situations but somehow, we just don't expect God to work for us personally. When the sea comes crashing in, when our world starts shaking underneath us, we don't go to God because we don't expect him to work miracles for us. Our faith seems to be out of commission. Remember when the disciples faced the storm, pulled at the oars, scooped water as quickly as they could, done everything themselves to try and save the boat from sinking and their faith never got out of its very limiting box until desperation drove them to wake the sleeping Jesus. He stilled the storm, settled the waters. Often we go through life, depending on our own expertise, our own strength, relying on our own work. That's why problems overwhelm and wash us overboard. Our small limiting faith sees only our own strength and work and it doesn't see the incredible power that God has given us by being able to pray to him and put our storm at his feet. "Where is your faith?" Jesus asked his disciples and is asking us here and now. The challenge of the word of God is to put our faith to work, whatever our challenge is, whatever chaos is threatening us, if we put our faith to work rather than our bodies and mind, then we won't be frantically trying to keep the boat afloat, we'll be in the stern resting with Jesus.
