GOD SLOT

I find that the busier I am, the more easily I become distracted: starting one job and then moving onto another before completing the first, looking at the latest email when the notification pings up on-screen, looking for the 'quick wins' rather than focussing on the things I have put in the 'too hard to deal with at the moment' pile. It can be easy for church life to become distracted too. In all the busy-ness, we can lose sight of the things that are important, particularly when it feels that there are so many competing priorities - each clamouring for our attention. Proverbs 4:25 reminds us to keep focussed: "Let your eyes look straight ahead; fix your gaze directly before you." And if we are left in any doubt what (or who) we should be focussing on, Hebrews 12:1-3 reminds us: "Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart." As we move towards Advent, it provides a good opportunity for us to check what we are focussing on.


