Gift Aid can boost Church finances: If you pay UK income or capital gains tax please help the Church by using the Gift Aid envelopes for your Open Plate donations. This will add approximately 25% to any donations you make, as the Church can reclaim the basic rate of tax from your donations. If you are or intend to donate via the Pledge Giving Scheme, you can complete a one-off Gift Aid declaration. Please ask for a pen if you need one.

To make a Gift Aid declaration, you will need to pay UK Income Tax and/or

Capital Gains Tax in any tax year greater than the amount of Gift Aid claimed on all your Gift Aid donations in that year, or you will be responsible for any difference. Income tax includes tax credits on UK dividend income. Boosting the Church income in this way will be a very welcome additional contribution to finances.

For our visitors and any residents eligible to Gift Aid:

PLEASE, if you are putting your donation in a Gift Aid envelope, would you make sure that the details on the front of the envelope are completed; if this is not done, we are unable to claim the tax refund.

GENERAL NOTICES

Coronavirus: our Diocese, on Wednesday, issued modified advice, concerning the conduct of worship, in light of the on-going situation concerning the coronavirus. The advice is as follows:

- "1. The sharing of the Peace should now avoid any physical contact.
- 2. Congregations should receive Communion in one kind (the consecrated wafer) with the President alone receiving the wine.
- 3. Please do continue to take all sensible hygienic precautions for the sake of protecting the health of others."

You may wish to be reassured that receiving communion in one kind only, does not diminish the nature of the Eucharist. It is a clear principle of Anglican theology that the sacrament of Holy Communion is present and complete in either of the consecrated elements.

We are also aware of the fact that the government has banned the gathering of more than 75 people in confined spaces with church services being included in the ban. Consideration is also being given as to how we handle the forthcoming AGM – further information will follow.

Ministry in the Parish: Until the end of the first week after Easter, The Reverend Andrew will be the only Priest in the Parish. Various adjustments have been made to accommodate this situation. Firstly, some services have been changed to Communion by Extension, which are taken

by our Readers. Details of when a service is changed will be notified in the Weekly Newssheet. Secondly, the time of the St Luke's service has been changed to 11.00am up until and including Sunday 19th April. After this, the 9.30am service time will be reinstated.

Looking further ahead: due to expected administrative delays by the Cypriot civil authorities, it is unlikely that The Reverend Ken will be licensed to take weddings during the forthcoming 'season'. This will mean that The Reverend Andrew will take all the weddings and Reverend Ken will pick up a good number of parish duties. Further information will follow once Ken is in place. Reverend Andrew.

The inclusion of names in our intercessions: we welcome the inclusion of the names of people, in need, in our intercessions. If you ask for a person's name to be included, please make sure that each month you keep us informed of your friend or family member's condition and whether they need to continue to be on our list. In discussion with the wardens, it has been decided that the inclusion of names will be tailored more closely to each church congregation. So, a person's name may be included, for example, in the St Luke's intercessions, as they are known to, or associated in some way with that congregation; but not included in the intercessions of the other churches. It is a privilege to pray for particular people, in need, and it may be the wish that their circumstances should not be disclosed. Otherwise, the wardens may know brief details. Reverend Andrew.

The Reverend Ken and Wendy Waters: The Reverend Ken has let us know that he and Wendy will be arriving in the parish on Wednesday 15th April. We look forward to their arrival and to welcoming them to the parish. Thank you to Rema Lawson, and to those who are helping her, as she makes arrangements for the house to be ready for the Waters' arrival. Reverend Andrew

The Reverend Jill Wheatley: The Reverend Jill and her husband Joe are spending more time on the island and she has applied and been granted Permission to Officiate status by Archbishop Michael. This will mean that she can be involved, in a small way, taking services at St Stephen's and St

Luke's. We extend a warm welcome to The Reverend Jill and look forward to her conducting services in the parish. We are particularly grateful for her assistance until The Reverend Ken arrives. Reverend Andrew.

Lent Courses: our two Lent courses continue. The Polis course runs on a Saturday morning (beginning at 11.00am) at St Luke's and is led by Ray Elliott. The Paphos course runs on a Tuesday morning (10.00 for 10.30am) at the parish house. It is not too late to join either course – please contact either Ray or Reverend Andrew for further details. Reverend Andrew.

Lent Appeal: as is customary, in the Parish, we will be holding a Lent Appeal for the Diocesan supported Ras Morbat Eye Clinic in the Yemen. A white envelope marked, Lent Appeal, will be available, from a sidesperson, for your donation. Please place it in the collection bags, as normal. At Synod, we received a very encouraging report on the work on this clinic which is staffed entirely by local Muslim doctors and nurses and supported by our Diocese along with some external donors. We have supported this clinic's work for several years, through our Lent appeal, and after hearing of their vital on-going work, I have no hesitation in commending our appeal to you. Reverend Andrew

Vacancies on Council: There are currently two vacancies on Council that will need to be filled at the AGM. As noted in last week's edition, we are looking for a new Human Resources representative (HR rep). It is not a post that requires great HR experience, but some knowledge would be useful. Graham Hare has long indicated that he wishes to stand down as our long-serving treasurer and will do so at the AGM. Please give consideration if you think that you could fill this role. Council has recently agreed to a slimming down of the treasurer's work in that there will now be an honorary treasurer dealing with the church finances and a deputy honorary treasurer dealing solely with the finances of the wedding ministry. This means that the job of parish treasurer has become smaller and more manageable. A parishioner has volunteered to take on the deputy honorary treasurer's role, dealing with the wedding ministry, and the AGM will be asked to confirm this kind offer. But, the need for a new

honorary treasurer is urgent. Please speak to Graham Hare if you would like to inquire about this post. Reverend Andrew.

Easter at Ayia Kyriaki: It is always lovely to have fresh flowers in church especially at Easter. However, fresh flowers are expensive so if you would care to give a donation, maybe in memory of a loved one who has died, it would be much appreciated.
