Gift Aid - The Anglican Church of Paphos, through the Jerusalem and East Mission Trust UK Endowment Fund, is recognised by the UK tax authorities as a registered UK charity. Any donations made by UK Taxpayers are eligible for Gift Aid. In order to participate, a Gift

We welcome the Rev'd Ian Toombs, a priest from England who has visited Cyprus for holidays and worshipped mainly at St. Luke's. He will be here over 4 short periods this year whilst also working on a Hospice project for a church agency and staying with Rev'd Marian Morgan, and has Nic's and the Bishop's permission to lead services and preach when available - as he is doing this Sunday at St. Luke's, and again in May at Ayia Kyriaki and St. Luke's and for our Ascension Day "Service in the Forest". 101 Club: An update on the progress made by the 101 club towards the church finances by members of the three churches in the Paphos Parish.

Total money collected by the end of February, in effect our first month of operation, €8470 of which €8000 has been given to the

Parish to be banked for their benefit.

This great start to our effort was in no small part due to the **ten members** who paid up front for the whole year, and a further **seven members** who paid for 6 months. This enabled us to get money to where it was needed in the shortest possible time for the greatest effect and is much appreciated, and it also assists us administratively.

We have been approached by one or two people who wished to decline their "winnings" so that the money could stay with the church for the maximum benefit of the church. We have now set up a facility on our spreadsheet for this to take place if you so indicate, just approach the Registrar or Treasurer of the 101 club and this will be added to your details with all the usual confidentiality if you so wish.

I close with one nugget of information given by Tim Sabben-Clare, our Registrar and architect of our 101 club Excel spreadsheet, "we have provided the church with 44% of the expected minimum profit within about 8.5% of the expected duration of the project". Not a bad start I think you will agree.

The "winnings" for the first month have now been handed over to the lucky participants. Remember "you have to be in it to win it", you can still enrol if you wish.
