

CHURCH FINANCE

We are nearing the end of our financial year and the prediction is that we should end with a small surplus, which is good but still slightly worrying. We

are totally self-supporting and at one time could support both a Parish Priest and an Associate Priest and this was mainly due to a thriving wedding ministry. Weddings have dramatically reduced in recent years and we had to take the decision that we could no longer afford an Associate Priest. At the moment we are just about breaking even on the current wedding ministry costs. The Parish side of the finance scales is where we have to look at. We have cut our outgoings as much as possible and we are just managing, however our costs rise next year so we have to also raise our income to cover the increase. The fundraising team have done brilliantly, but they cannot raise the extra cash alone. I would ask you all to think and pray on your contributions to the church; can you afford to give a little extra? Could you also look at paying by a monthly standing order or direct debit as this makes budgeting for the year easier and more accurate. To coin a phrase from somewhere... 'Every little bit helps'. "Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." (2 Corinthians 9:7) Thank you. KW
