GOD SLOT

How well we examine ourselves and clear away the weeds that stunt our Christian growth will determine how much of the "rich soil" our lives have. We need to do what farmers do after planting seed:

Tilling

Fertilising

Pruning

providing the proper balance to encourage growth.

Let's look at these.

Tilling. Loosening soil and exposing it to air might remind us to keep a fresh perspective and constantly expose ourselves to new ways of understanding what God has in mind for us in every situation.

Fertilising. Can anything better illustrate how much we need to have added to our thoughts and knowledge of God? Read and understand the Bible. Hear and understand stories of the saints of old and the committed examples of Christians whom we admire. How can we follow in their steps.

Pruning. It's a matter of priorities, isn't it? Keep and nurture the portion of our spiritual growth that is most in keeping with God and cut away what is less productive.

Providing the proper balance to encourage growth. Supplying the proper ratio of caring, sharing and loving - it's almost always about balance, isn't it? For instance, it's not a matter of worship and prayer verses good works and social action, but attending to both, letting each inform the other. Finding the right priority for the given moment, emphasising what love most demands at a certain time, can produce the most abundance when we keep the many aspects of our Christian lives in proper balance.

Think how this process can work in making our Christian life richer. Let our

imagination go. Look for the opportunities that Jesus is giving us every day to care for His people. And when we see them step out in faith and do His will.

CHURCH FINANCES

June was another good month in which net income for the year moved into surplus. Church income for the year is €10,000 above budget helped by strong fundraising. This month we have paid €1,212 Earthquake to the Disasters Emergency Committee (DEC) Syria and Turkey Earthquake Appeal. The Wedding Ministry bookings for the year currently remain at 50 events in total against a budget of 40.
